

RESOLUTION No. 2008-20-707

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MIAMI GARDENS, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXPEND THE SUM OF \$62,874.00 FOR STAMPED CONCRETE IMPROVEMENTS ON NORTHWEST 2 AVENUE (STATE ROAD 441) AND NORTHWEST 215TH STREET INTERSECTION; PROVIDING FOR THE ADOPTION OF REPRESENTATIONS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, a Livable Community Corridor Study was conducted for Northwest 2nd Avenue, and

WHEREAS, some of the matters addressed were pedestrian safety and aesthetic/beautification concerns, and

WHEREAS, the City is in the process of working with the Florida Department of Transportation ("FDOT") to enhance intersection treatments along State Road 441 with stamped concrete pedestrian crossings, and

WHEREAS, the FDOT intends to install regular concrete sidewalks into the intersection, and

WHEREAS, the City would like to pay for stamped concrete instead of regular concrete,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MIAMI GARDENS, FLORIDA, as follows:

Section 1. ADOPTION OF REPRESENTATIONS: The foregoing Whereas paragraphs are hereby ratified and confirmed as being true, and the same are hereby made a specific part of this Resolution.

Section 2. AUTHORIZATION: The City Council hereby authorizes the City Manager to expend the sum of \$62,874.00 for stamped concrete improvements on Northwest 2nd Avenue (State Road 441) at the Northwest 215 Street Intersection.

Section 3. EFFECTIVE DATE: This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its final passage.

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
Staff Summary

A Livable Community Corridor Study was conducted for NW 2 Avenue (441) that provided a long-term plan for this vital redevelopment corridor in Miami Gardens. The Plan addressed transportation, transit and mobility enhancements as well as pedestrian safety, bike-paths, traffic, mixed-use development, beautification and economic opportunities to enhance livability. Public workshops built consensus with beautification being a high priority. In addition to implementing interim development guidelines for streetscape and landscape along the corridor, the City is now working with FDOT to integrate the SR-7 Corridor Plan into the 2010/11 FDOT Resurfacing project. The City is recommending enhanced intersection treatment with stamped concrete pedestrian crossings. In addition to enhanced landscape standards, the Plan calls for wider sidewalks, from the standard six (6) feet to ten (10) feet. As implementation of the Plan's recommendations progresses, stamped concrete for the sidewalks represents another important feature of this redevelopment and beautification effort.

The City has communicated our long term plans to FDOT. As such, FDOT's north project, which consists of new regular concrete sidewalks approximately 1200 feet into the City limits was proposed, and along with the City's long term plan has upgraded to stamped concrete. The difference between the regular concrete sidewalk and stamp concrete is \$62,874. The funds are available through the City's Capital Improvement Project for the NW 2 Avenue/441 corridor.

In the Council's agenda, staff has also submitted for Council approval for a FDOT Memorandum of Agreement to take over the stamped concrete sidewalks as they are installed on NW 2 Avenue/441. This will set the future for the sidewalk improvements needed under the City's Redevelopment plan for the corridor.

RECOMMENDATION: That the City Council approve the amount of \$62, 874 for the stamp concrete improvements on NW 2 Avenue/441.

Please find the attached estimate for the requested modifications to the existing plans for the SR 7 reconstruction project. The City has requested that the proposed plain concrete pavement be upgraded to a stamped concrete pattern.

The color choice shall be "Brick red" mixed with "Gray" and shall be approved by the City of Miami Gardens prior to placement. The order of magnitude for this change has been estimated at \$ 62,874.00. The project square yardage total has been calculated and multiplied by the contractor unit price of \$36.00 SY for this work.
